5. Contracts

Consider the award or rejection of contracts for highway construction and maintenance, and construction and rehabilitation of buildings (Presentation)

These proposed minute orders contain information concerning the receipt of bids for highway improvement contracts. The department may reschedule receipt of bids for those projects where the commission rejects all bids. Those bids accepted by the commission will result in conditional contract awards to the low bidders. Contract award conditions may involve securing funding from other sources, the contractor's ability to satisfy federal DBE subcontracting requirements, or other requirements as outlined in the project bid proposal.

6. **Discussion Items**

a. **Unified Transportation Program (UTP)** Discussion of the draft 2023 Unified Transportation Program (Presentation)

The Unified Transportation Program (UTP) is a 10-year statewide plan for transportation project development. Staff will facilitate a discussion of the draft 2023 UTP.

b. **Legislative Appropriations Request** (Presentation)

Discussion regarding the development of the Texas Department of Transportation's Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Legislative Appropriations Request (LAR). Staff will discuss the development of the LAR with the commission and seek direction on components of the LAR.

7. **Aviation**

Various Counties - Consider the award of federal non-primary entitlement grant funding, federal apportionment grant funding for airport improvement projects at various locations (MO) Federal law authorizes the award of federal non-primary entitlement grant funding and federal apportionment grant funding to preserve and improve the state's general aviation system.

8. **Public Transportation**

Various Counties - Consider the award of state and federal funds to multiple entities for a variety of program-eligible purposes (MO)

The awards identified in this minute order reflect the allocation of fiscal year 2023 state funds to large urban, small urban, and rural transit districts; the allocation of Section 5311 funds to rural transit districts; and the allocation of Section 5339 funds to rural transit districts.

9. **State Infrastructure Bank** (Presentation)

Williamson County - Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation - Consider final approval of a request from the Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation for a State Infrastructure Bank loan in the amount of up to \$27,000,000 to pay for the costs of utility relocation, right-of-way acquisition and construction necessary for a non-tolled, off-system project involving various improvements to Gattis School Road in Williamson County, Texas (MO)

Round Rock Transportation and Economic Development Corporation (Round Rock TEDC) will secure the loan with a pledge of sales tax revenue. The loan will be used to pay Round Rock TEDC's costs associated with utility relocation, right-of-way acquisition and construction necessary for a non-tolled, off-system project involving various improvements to Gattis School Road in Williamson County, Texas.

10. **Promulgation of Administrative Rules** Under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code **Rules Proposal**

Chapter 15 - Ship Channel Improvement Revolving Loan Program amendment to §15.252 relating to eligible applicants and creation of §15.262 relating to the loan terms and forms of financial assistance (MO)

The proposed rule amendment and creation modifies the rules to align with legislative changes to Chapter 56 of the Transportation Code. The amendment to §15.252 identifies an eligible applicant as an entity that is responsible for providing revenue or security for the local share of qualified project costs. The creation of §15.262 incorporates new terms and forms of financial assistance pursuant to Transportation Code, §56.003(a).

11. Real Estate Disposition

Travis County - Consider the grant of authority to the department for the transfer and sale of real property in Travis County, Texas (MO)

As part of the department's campus consolidation project, all department employees and equipment will move from the Camp Hubbard property. Senate Bill 1349 of the 85th Legislature allows the department to transfer all or part of that property to the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles and to sell any remaining part of that property to one or more financial regulatory agencies under terms that are acceptable to the parties. The department requests the commission authorize the executive director to take all necessary steps to transfer and sell the Camp Hubbard property.

12. Truck Lane Restrictions

Denton County - Consider the approval of proposed lane use restrictions for trucks on certain highways in Denton County (MO)

Transportation Code 545.0651 authorizes the commission to restrict a class of vehicles to two or more lanes of a highway. This minute order establishes a restriction for trucks using a designated section of I-35 and I-35E in Denton County. The department worked in conjunction with local jurisdictions in this county to develop the proposed lane restrictions.

13. Purchase of Right of Way

Lubbock County - Consider authorizing the acquisition of right of way, utility adjustments, and relocation assistance in connection with, a transportation facility (MO)

State law authorizes the commission to acquire real property. The department desires to purchase property on Loop 88 in Lubbock County for use in or in connection with a transportation facility.

14. Eminent Domain Proceedings

Various Counties - Consider the authorization of the filing of condemnation proceedings to acquire real property by eminent domain for non-controlled and controlled access highways (see attached itemized list) (MO)

Commission findings, determinations, and authorizations for the state, by motion made in accordance with Senate Bill 18, 82nd Legislature, to acquire by eminent domain, upon the payment of adequate and just compensation, various ownership interests in specific parcels of real property that are needed to develop or improve both non-controlled and controlled access state highways, to include requesting the state attorney general to bring and pursue condemnation suits relating to those specific parcels of real property described in the attached itemized list.

15. Routine Minute Orders and Reports

a. **Donations to the Department**

Various Districts - Consider the acknowledgment of donations with a value of \$500 or more, including donations of money, materials, services, or real property, that are made to the department for the purpose of assisting the department in carrying out its functions and duties or for improving access to or from a highway on the state highway system (see attached itemized list) (MO)

State statutes require the commission to acknowledge the acceptance of a gift to the department that is valued at \$500 or more. By the adoption of this minute order, the commission acknowledges the receipt and acceptance of the property specified in the minute order.

15. Routine Minute Orders and Reports (continued)

b. Real Estate Dispositions

The commission must approve the sales, transfers, and exchanges of state rights of way and other real properties that are no longer needed for a state highway purpose. It must also approve, accept, and acknowledge donations to the state of real property that is valued at \$500 or more.

- (1) **Bastrop County** FM 969 Consider an easement release to the underlying fee owner (MO)

 The district has determined that the easement is no longer needed for highway purposes.

 The easement may be released to the underlying fee owner.
- (2) **Bexar County** I-10 Consider an easement release to the underlying fee owner (MO)

 The district has determined that the easement is no longer needed for highway purposes.

 The easement may be released to the underlying fee owner.
- (3) **Harris County** SH 249 Consider the sale of right of way to an abutting landowner (MO)

 The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. An abutting landowner has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the requester.
- (4) **Montague County** US 82 Consider a recommendation to the governor regarding the execution and delivery of a quitclaim deed, correction deed, or other conveyance instrument necessary to resolve an ambiguity or error that conveyed an interest in real property to the state for a highway right of way and which resulted in the acquisition of an interest in real property not intended to be included and not needed for a highway purpose (MO)

 The district has determined that the execution and delivery of corrective instruments is necessary.
- (5) **Tarrant County** SS 303 Consider an easement release to the underlying fee owner (MO)

 The district has determined that the easement is no longer needed for highway purposes.

 The easement may be released to the underlying fee owner.
- (6) **Jefferson County** SH 87 Consider an exchange of real property (MO) The district has determined that certain real property is no longer needed for a state highway purpose. PALNG Common Facilities Company, LLC has entered into an Amended Agreement to Accept Donation and Exchange of Right of Way with the department whereby it would acquire the unneeded real property (Tract 1) and a release of an easement encumbering other property (Tract 2) in exchange for certain land (Parcel A) that is needed for a state highway purpose. PALNG Common Facilities Company, LLC will donate to the department the \$58,392,358 difference in values at closing.

c. Reports

(1) Compliance Division Report

State law requires the commission to establish a compliance program, which must include a Compliance Division to oversee the program. The Compliance Division is responsible for acting to prevent and detect serious breaches of department policy, fraud, waste, and abuse of office, including any acts of criminal conduct within the department. The Compliance Division is required to provide a monthly report to the commission regarding investigations and a summary of information relating to trends and recommendations.

(2) Environmental Report

Consider the acceptance of the report on projects being processed under the procedures of Transportation Code, Chapter 201, Subchapter I-1 (Report) The report identifies projects with a local government sponsor being processed under the environmental review procedures set forth in Transportation Code, Chapter 201, Subchapter I-1. A report must be submitted twice a year to the commission, as required by Transportation Code, §201.762(a).

d. Finance

(1) Central Texas Turnpike System Bonds

Consider approving the Ninth Supplemental Indenture authorizing the issuance of one or more series of Central Texas Turnpike System (CTTS) revenue refunding bonds to refund all or any portion of the outstanding CTTS bonds, the documents relating to such bonds including any additional supplemental indentures necessary to comply with the CTTS master trust indenture, and the refinancing or remarketing of certain outstanding CTTS bonds without incurring additional debt and without extending the final maturity if financial market conditions are favorable for refinancing; and designating department officials to take all actions necessary to deliver the bonds (MO) This action provides final authorization for the chief financial officer and other designated department officials to move forward with remarketing outstanding CTTS bonds subject to mandatory tender, the issuance of one or more series of CTTS revenue refunding bonds to refund and/or refinance all or any portion of outstanding bonds and approve official statements, bond purchase contracts, escrow agreements, and other related documents as authorized by Government Code Chapters 1207 and 1371. Any series of refunding bonds must achieve a net present value debt service savings of at least 3% of the bonds refunded and/or provide for the refinancing of outstanding variable rate bonds.

(2) State Highway Fund Bonds

Consider approving the Tenth Supplemental Resolution authorizing the issuance of State Highway Fund revenue refunding bonds in one or more series, the documents relating to the issuance of such bonds, and the refinancing or remarketing of certain outstanding State Highway Fund revenue bonds without incurring additional debt and without extending the final maturity if financial market conditions are favorable for refinancing; and designating department officials to take all actions necessary to deliver the bonds (MO)

This action provides final authorization for the chief financial officer and other designated

This action provides final authorization for the chief financial officer and other designated department officials to move forward with the issuance of one or more series of State Highway Fund revenue refunding bonds to refund and/or refinance all or any portion of outstanding bonds and approve official statements, reoffering memoranda, bond purchase contracts, escrow agreements, and other related documents, as authorized under Section 49-n, Article III of the Texas Constitution, Transportation Code §222.003, and Government Code Chapters 1207 and 1371. Any series of refunding bonds must achieve a net present value debt service savings of at least 3% of the bonds refunded and/or provide for the refinancing of outstanding variable rate bonds.

d. Finance (continued)

(3) Texas Mobility Fund Bonds

Consider approving the Fourteenth Supplemental Resolution authorizing the issuance of Texas Mobility Fund refunding bonds in one or more series, the documents relating to the issuance of such bonds, and the refinancing or remarketing of certain outstanding Texas Mobility Fund bonds without incurring additional debt and without extending the final maturity if financial market conditions are favorable for refinancing; and designating department officials to take all actions necessary to deliver the bonds (MO)

This action provides final authorization for the chief financial officer and other designated department officials to move forward with the issuance of one or more series of Texas Mobility Fund refunding bonds to refund and/or refinance all or any portion of outstanding bonds, and approve official statements, reoffering memoranda, bond purchase contracts, escrow agreements, and other related documents, as authorized under Section 49-k, Article III of the Texas Constitution, Transportation Code Chapter 201, Subchapter M, and Government Code Chapters 1207 and 1371. Any series of refunding bonds must achieve a net present value debt service savings of at least 3% of the bonds refunded and/or provide for the refinancing of variable rate bonds.

(4) Highway Improvement General Obligation Bonds Consider approving the Sixth Supplemental Resolution

Consider approving the Sixth Supplemental Resolution authorizing the issuance of Highway Improvement General Obligation (HIGO) refunding bonds in one or more series, the documents relating to the issuance of such bonds, and the refinancing of certain outstanding HIGO bonds without incurring additional debt and without extending the final maturity if financial market conditions are favorable for refinancing; and designating department officials to take all actions necessary to deliver the bonds (MO)

This action provides final authorization for the chief financial officer and other designated department officials to move forward with the issuance of one or more series of general obligation refunding bonds to refund all or any portion of outstanding bonds and approve official statements, bond purchase contracts, escrow agreements, and other related documents, as authorized under Section 49-p, Article III of the Texas Constitution, Transportation Code §222.004, and Government Code Chapters 1207 and 1371. Any series of refunding bonds must achieve a net present value debt service savings of at least 3% of the bonds refunded and/or provide for the refinancing of variable rate bonds.

e. Transportation Planning

Various Counties - Consider concurrence with the Regional Transportation Council of the North Central Texas Council of Governments' funding of construction and other project development costs of projects to be advanced through the use of payments received from the North Texas Tollway Authority in accordance with the SH 121 Toll Project Agreement (MO)

The department has established a separate fund to account for and track projects and project costs funded with the SH 121 payments. This minute order authorizes the funding of additional project costs and changes to the list of previously-approved projects. The project costs to be funded were selected through a cooperative process with the Regional Transportation Council.

f. Speed Zones

Various Counties - Consider the establishment or alteration of regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state (MO)

This minute order establishes or alters regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state.

16. Executive Session Pursuant to Government Code, Chapter 551 Section 551.071 - Consultation with and advice from legal counsel regarding

any item on this agenda, pending or contemplated litigation, or other legal matters.

OPEN COMMENT PERIOD - At the conclusion of all other agenda items, the commission will allow an open comment period, not to exceed one hour, to receive public comment on any other matter that is under the jurisdiction of the department. No action will be taken. Each speaker will be allowed a maximum of three minutes. Speakers must be signed up prior to the beginning of the open comment period.
