- 3. **Consider the approval of the Minutes** of the August 30, 2022, regular meeting of the Texas Transportation Commission

4. Contracts

Consider the award or rejection of contracts for highway construction and maintenance, and construction and rehabilitation of buildings, consider the approval of an increase in funds for certain highway construction projects that received bids with cost overruns, and consider award of a project in Fannin County to the second lowest bidder per the provisions of 43 TAC 9.17(d) (Presentation)

These proposed minute orders contain information concerning the receipt of bids for highway improvement contracts and a proposal to increase funds from categories 2, 4 and/or 12 for certain projects. The department may reschedule receipt of bids for those projects where the commission rejects all bids or reassess funding proposals. Those bids and funding increases accepted by the commission will result in conditional contract awards to the low bidders. Contract award conditions may involve securing funding from other sources, the contractor's ability to satisfy federal DBE subcontracting requirements, or other requirements as outlined in the project bid proposal. The minute orders also contain the award of a Fannin County maintenance project to the second lowest bidder due to the withdrawal of the lowest bidder.

- b. **Highway Improvements and Other Transportation Facilities** (MO)
 Rescind award of and reject WALLER COUNTY Project C 114-11-86, previously awarded August 30, 2022, by Minute Order 116293 (see attached itemized list) (MO). It is necessary to rescind the previous awarded of WALLER COUNTY Project C 114-11-86 and reject all bids on the respective project in the best interest of the state.

5. Maritime

Consider the approval of the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway Report (MO) (Report) The Gulf Intracoastal Waterway (GIWW) is an important component of the Texas multimodal transportation system. The department acts as the non-federal sponsor of the GIWW and collaborates with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to resolve issues on the GIWW. State law requires the commission to continually evaluate the impact of the GIWW on the state and to publish and present a report to each regular session of the legislature.

6. Environmental Covenant

Harris County - Consider authorizing the executive director of the Texas Department of Transportation to execute an environmental restrictive covenant, in favor of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and the State of Texas, imposing certain restrictions on a section of right-of-way at I-10 and Beltway 8, in Harris County (MO)

This minute order authorizes the executive director to execute a restrictive covenant as part of a response action undertaken by Weatherford US, Inc. to address contamination beneath property owned by the department located at I-10 and Beltway 8. The contamination is believed to be from continued industrial use of the property for over 35 years.

7. **Annual Toll Rates**

- a. **Travis and Williamson Counties** Consider the approval of a modified toll rate escalation percentage and toll rates for the Central Texas Turnpike System, consisting of the SH 130 (Segments 1-4), SH 45N, Loop 1 (from FM 734 to SH 45N), and SH 45SE system elements (MO)
 - This minute order approves a modified toll rate escalation percentage to pause the escalation of the toll rates for calendar year 2023 for the Central Texas Turnpike System. This MO also acknowledges that the department has determined and reported to the Commission the annual toll rate escalation percentage dictated by the commission's Toll Rate Escalation Policy; therefore, the department is not required to report it at the commission's October meeting this year.
- b. **Grimes and Montgomery Counties** Consider the approval of a modified toll rate escalation percentage and toll rates for the SH 249 System, comprised of Segment 1 of the SH 249 Project extending SH 249 from FM 1774 in Pinehurst to FM 1774 in Todd Mission (MO)

This minute order approves a modified toll rate escalation percentage to pause the escalation of the toll rates for calendar year 2023 for the SH 249 System. This MO also acknowledges that the department has determined and reported to the Commission the annual toll rate escalation percentage dictated by the commission's Toll Rate Escalation Policy; therefore, the department is not required to report it at the commission's October meeting this year.

7. Annual Toll Rates (continued)

c. Various Counties - Consider the approval of a modified toll rate escalation percentage and toll rates for portions of SH 99 (Grand Parkway) consisting of the tolled portion of Segment D in Harris County, Segments E, F-1, F-2, G, H, I-1, I-2A and I-2B (MO) This minute order approves a modified toll rate escalation percentage to pause the escalation of the toll rates for calendar year 2023 for the tolled portion of Grand Parkway Segment D in Harris County and for Segments E, F-1, F-2, G, H, I-1, I-2A and I-2B, contingent upon an amendment to or waiver of the Market Valuation Waiver Agreement for the Grand Parkway Project effective March 25, 2009, the receipt of a Certificate from the Traffic and Revenue Consultant, and amendment of the Commission's Toll Rate Escalation Policy for the Grand Parkway System. This MO also acknowledges that the department has determined and reported to the Commission the annual toll rate escalation percentage dictated by the commission's Toll Rate Escalation Policy; therefore, the department is not required to report it at the commission's October meeting this year.

8. Contested Case

Webb County - Texas Department of Transportation v. Killam Development, Ltd. - Consider action on proposal for decision by administrative law judge concerning the Department's assessment of administrative penalties, final order (MO)

The Texas Department of Transportation (Department) issued violation notices to Killam Development, Ltd. (Killam) for two unpermitted commercial digital signs located in Laredo, Texas. After Killam's failure to obtain a permit or remove the signs, the Department issued a Notice of Administrative Penalties against Killam. After an appeal by Killam and a hearing on the matter, The State Office of Administrative Hearings issued a Proposal for Decision recommending that the Department may assess a total of \$176,000.00 in administrative penalties against Killam Development, Ltd.

9. State Infrastructure Bank

Houston County - City of Crockett - Consider preliminary approval of a request from the City of Crockett for a State Infrastructure Bank loan in the amount of up to \$6,000,000 to pay for the costs of utility relocation and construction necessary for up to 11 non-tolled, off-system projects involving various street improvements in Houston County, Texas (MO) (Presentation) City of Crockett (City) will secure the loan with a pledge of ad-valorem taxes. The loan will be used to pay the City's costs associated with utility relocation and construction necessary for up to 11 non-tolled, off-system projects involving various improvements to Martin Luther King Boulevard, West Houston, East Bell Avenue, Cedar Street, North Grace Street, South Grace Street, South 10th Street, South 7th Street, Clark Avenue, East San Jacinto Avenue, and North 10th Street in Houston County, Texas.

10. Promulgation of Administrative Rules Under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, and the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code, Chapter 2001: Final Rules Adoption

a. Chapter 15 - Ship Channel Improvement Revolving Loan Program

Amendment to §15.252 relating to eligible applicants and creation of §15.262 relating to the loan terms and forms of financial assistance (MO)

The rulemaking modifies the rules to align with legislative changes to Chapter 56 of the Transportation Code. The amendment to §15.252 identifies an eligible applicant as an entity that is responsible for providing revenue or security for the local share of qualified project costs. The creation of §15.262 incorporates new terms and forms of financial assistance pursuant to Transportation Code, §56.003(a).

10. **Promulgation of Administrative Rules** Under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, and the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code, Chapter 2001:

Final Rules Adoption (continued)

b. Chapter 21 - Right of Way

Amendments to §§21.31, 21.37, 21.38, 21.40, and 21.41, relating to Utility Accommodation and Repeal of §§21.921-21.930 relating to Utility Relocation Prepayment Funding Agreements (MO)

Senate Bill 507, 87th Legislature requires the commission adopt rules to create a right of way accommodation process for broadband only providers. The amendments to §§21.31, 21.37, 21.38, 21.40, and 21.41 prescribe minimum requirements for the accommodation, method, materials, and location for the installation, adjustment, and maintenance of broadband facilities under the accommodation process. These proposed revisions will also reflect current advances in technologies, construction practices, and safety standards. Transportation Code, §203.0922, which authorized a Utility Relocation Prepayment Funding program, expired on September 1, 2013. The repeal of §§21.921-21.930 removes this prepayment funding program from the rules.

11. Eminent Domain Proceedings

Various Counties - Consider the authorization of the filing of condemnation proceedings to acquire real property by eminent domain for non-controlled and controlled access highways (see attached itemized list) (MO)

Commission findings, determinations, and authorizations for the state, by motion made in accordance with Senate Bill 18, 82nd Legislature, to acquire by eminent domain, upon the payment of adequate and just compensation, various ownership interests in specific parcels of real property that are needed to develop or improve both non-controlled and controlled access state highways, to include requesting the state attorney general to bring and pursue condemnation suits relating to those specific parcels of real property described in the attached itemized list.

12. Routine Minute Orders and Reports

a. **Donations to the Department**

Various Districts - Consider the acknowledgment of donations with a value of \$500 or more, including donations of money, materials, services, or real property, that are made to the department for the purpose of assisting the department in carrying out its functions and duties or for improving access to or from a highway on the state highway system (see attached itemized list) (MO)

State statutes require the commission to acknowledge the acceptance of a gift to the department that is valued at \$500 or more. By the adoption of this minute order, the commission acknowledges the receipt and acceptance of the property specified in the minute order.

b. Real Estate Dispositions

The commission must approve the sales, transfers, and exchanges of state rights of way and other real properties that are no longer needed for a state highway purpose. It must also approve, accept, and acknowledge donations to the state of real property that is valued at \$500 or more.

(1) **Ector County** - FM 2227 - Consider the sale of an easement to an abutting landowner (MO)

The district has determined that the easement is no longer needed for highway purposes. An abutting landowner has requested to purchase the easement, and it may be sold to the requester.

(2) **Grayson County** - US 69 - Consider the sale of right of way to an abutting landowner (MO)

The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes. An abutting landowner has requested to purchase the land, and it may be sold to the requester.

12. Routine Minute Orders and Reports (continued)

- b. Real Estate Dispositions (continued)
 - (3) **Tarrant County** US 377 Consider the quitclaim to a county or municipality of an interest in real property that might have accrued to the state by use. The interest in the real property was acquired and held by Tarrant County in its own name for use by the state (MO)
 - The district has determined that the land is no longer needed for highway purposes, and Tarrant County has requested the quitclaim from the state.
 - (4) **Travis County** SH 130 Consider the designation of two locations on the SH 130 northbound on-ramp at Parmer Lane at which access will be permitted to the abutting property (MO)

The designation of one break in the control-of-access line will allow the abutting landowner to open one driveway for ingress from the SH 130 northbound on-ramp at Parmer Lane. The designation of a second break in the control-of-access line will allow the abutting landowner to open one driveway for temporary emergency egress to the SH 130 northbound on-ramp at Parmer Lane. The district has determined that access may be permitted at the designated locations.

(5) **Williamson County** - Spur 26 - Consider an easement release to the underlying fee owner (MO)

The district has determined that the easement is no longer needed for highway purposes. The easement may be released to the underlying fee owner.

c. Reports

(1) Compliance Division Report

State law requires the commission to establish a compliance program, which must include a Compliance Division to oversee the program. The Compliance Division is responsible for acting to prevent and detect serious breaches of department policy, fraud, waste, and abuse of office, including any acts of criminal conduct within the department. The Compliance Division is required to provide a monthly report to the commission regarding investigations and a summary of information relating to trends and recommendations.

(2) **Dallas and Denton Counties** - Annual Inspection Report for the I-35E Managed Lanes Project (Report)

The commission financed a portion of the costs of the project through a Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act loan evidenced by a note issued pursuant to a trust agreement. In accordance with Section 504 of the trust agreement, the commission caused the general engineering consultant to make an inspection of the project on or before the 90th day prior to the end of the fiscal year and to submit a report to the commission. A copy of the report shall be filed with the trustee.

d. Highway Designations

- (1) **Bosque County** Consider designating FM 56 on a new location and designating segments of FM 56 and FM 2114 along County Road 3615 (MO) This minute order (1) designates FM 56 on a new location from existing FM 56 southeastward to existing County Road 3615, a distance of approximately 0.2 miles; (2) designates a segment of FM 56 along County Road 3615 from the new location of FM 56 southwestward to existing FM 56, a distance of approximately 0.2 miles; and (3) designates a segment of FM 2114 along County Road 3615 from existing FM 2114 southwestward to the new location of FM 56, a distance of approximately 0.2 miles.
- (2) **Wharton County** In the city of Wharton, consider extending the designation of FM 1301 along a new location on the state highway system (MO) This minute order extends the designation of FM 1301 along a new location on the state highway system from the intersection of SH 60 and existing FM 1301 northwestward to US 59, a distance of approximately 1.7 miles.

12. Routine Minute Orders and Reports (continued)

e. Designation of Access Control

Harris County - I-10, just east of Katy - Consider the designation of five locations on the westbound frontage road of I-10 at which access will be permitted to the abutting property (MO)

The designation of five breaks in the control-of-access line (one 90.58-foot, one 51.29-foot, one 90.22-foot, one 80.01-foot, and one 51.00-foot) will allow the abutting landowner to open five mixed-use (commercial / residential) driveways for access to and from the westbound frontage road of I-10. The District has determined that access may be permitted at the designated location.

f. Rail Clearance Deviations

Montgomery County - Consider the approval of rail clearance deviations (MO) *This minute order authorizes approval of applications for rail clearance deviations, which are waivers from clearance provisions for structures over and alongside railway tracks.*

g. Speed Zones

Various Counties - Consider the establishment or alteration of regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state (MO) *This minute order establishes or alters regulatory and construction speed zones on various sections of highways in the state.*

13. **Executive Session** Pursuant to Government Code, Chapter 551 **Section 551.071** - Consultation with and advice from legal counsel regarding any item on this agenda, pending or contemplated litigation, or other legal matters.

OPEN COMMENT PERIOD - At the conclusion of all other agenda items, the commission will allow an open comment period, not to exceed one hour, to receive public comment on any other matter that is under the jurisdiction of the department. No action will be taken. Each speaker will be allowed a maximum of three minutes. Speakers must be signed up prior to the beginning of the open comment period.
